60th anniversary

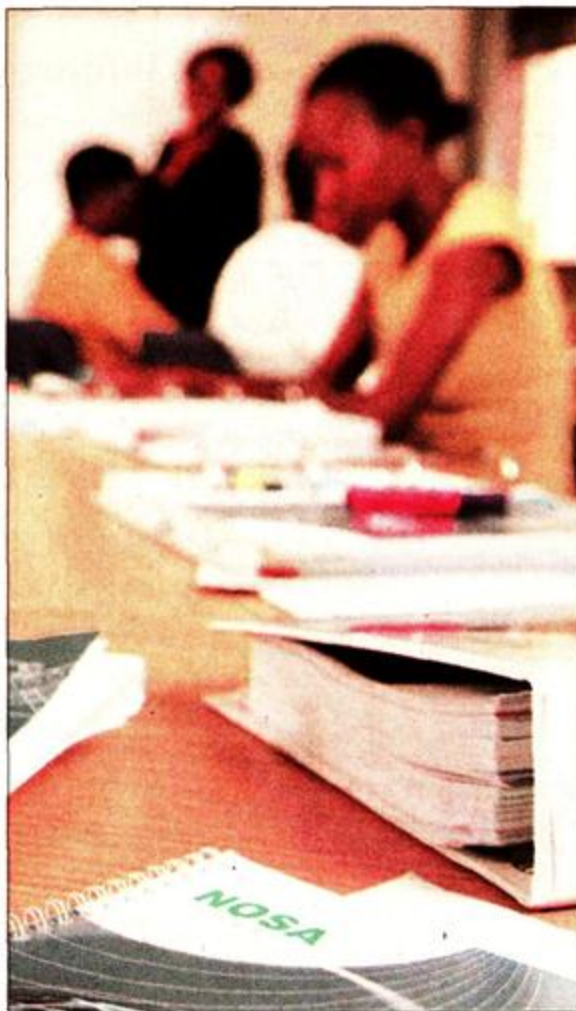
Celebrating its 60th anniversary this year, NOSA provides an integrated service, focusing on training, auditing and certification, as well as consulting.
